From the Rector's Desk

Several of you have begun asking who it is that will be filling in for me whilst I'm away on sabbatical. So although there's still some negotiating to be done, and even though his name is not quite yet on the dotted line, let me introduce you to St. Peter's "locum tenens"—the "placeholder" or supply priest who will be here from May 1 through July 31: The Reverend Dr. John Douglas Wigner, Jr., a native of Baltimore, Maryland (as was my father), son of John D. and Bernice J. Wigner. He graduated from VPI (now known as Virginia Tech) in 1965 with a B.S., from Virginia Theological Seminary in 1972 with an M.Div., and in 2007 again from VTS with a D.Min. He also holds a certificate from General Theological Seminary. He was ordained a Deacon on May 27, 1972, and a Priest on May 13, 1973, both by The Right Reverend Robert Bruce Hall, who was at that time Bishop of Virginia. On November 28, 1987, he married Nancy Hein. They have two children.

Doug has had a long and varied career. He served as Rector of St. Paul's Church, Lynchburg, Virginia, from 1997 until his retirement in 2009. In gratitude for his service, St. Paul's named him Rector Emeritus. He also served as Rector of St. Peter's Parish Church (that's us!) from 1990-1997. Before that he was the interim associate at St. John's, Stamford, Connecticut, 1986-1989; Rector of St. Paul's, Woodbury, Connecticut, 1977-1986; associate at St. Christopher's, Springfield, Virginia, 1974-1977; and as curate at the Church of the Holy Comforter, Vienna, Virginia, 1972-1974. Since his retirement he has served as supply priest both long-term and short-term for several churches in the Richmond area, most notably Christ Church, Glen Allen.

He has also served a number of diocesan positions. Without going into particulars, let me list only these: Standing Committee, Long-Range Planning Committee, Board of Examining Chaplains, Commission on Ministry, Dean of his Region, Alternate Deputy to General Convention, Resolutions Committee, Executive Board, Committee on Church Revitalization, and Trustee of Virginia Theological Seminary. It makes me tired just reading the list!

The Vestry and Doug are still working out their agreement, as I said, but he's not here to fix anything or change anything. He's here to see "the Word duly preached and the Sacraments rightly administered." The Vestry will be in charge of day-to-day operations. Life will continue as normal. He will celebrate the Sunday Services—two each Sunday through May 22, and one each Sunday beginning May 29. Doug will conduct funerals and visit hospitals, and probably spend one half-day in the office each week. But again, that's all tentative and still being finalized.

On a different subject, by the time you read this our Annual Congregational Meeting will have come and gone. You will have heard various people tell you what went on at St. Peter's in 2015, and how St. Peter's affected life in our community and in the wider world. A financial report will have been given and the 2016 budget presented. We will have thanked the outgoing Vestry members for their three-year terms of service: Kristin Swynford, our Senior Warden; Steve Miles, our Junior Warden and Worship Commission Representative; and Chrissy Wagner, our Christian Education Commission Representative. All of them have done outstandingly well. We will have also elected their replacements: Matt Danielson, Bill Lindsey, and Abbitt Woodall, and we welcome them to their new Vestry terms. A new year full of opportunities and challenges lies ahead of us. We do so with an excellent staff, for whom I am tremendously grateful: Sherri Hardiman, our Parish Administrator, who does more than anyone realizes and without whom the wheels would grind to a halt; Joyce Molina, our Organist and Choirmaster, who has brought new life and energy to our music program; Brenda Clark, our Sexton, who is often unseen but whose work is both visible and greatly appreciated; and Zoe Wallace, our part-time nursery worker and newest employee, whom we are very happy to have onboard.

History and Genealogy Corner

If they are mostly a "quick look-up," I will simply mail the information to the requestor. However, sometimes the requests are detailed. We received one such request in December.

As we know, our own Richardson Hall is named in honor of Richard Cunningham Richardson, former Commonwealth Attorney in New Kent. I volunteered to assist Mr. Richardson in his research. 


